Ginning Updates

Ginning is progressing nicely with some really good results coming out. Lint turnouts have been high, and classing results are good. There was some high mic on irrigated cotton reported, but overall quality is said to be the best seen for several years. Cotton price slowly rising again, with good outlook for future.



CottonInfo Fact Sheet – Turn Out

Technical Lead for Fibre Quality, René van der Sluijs, compiled a factsheet on turnout outlining the three key components of turn out.

Seed cotton that is delivered to the gin contains three main components: fibre, seed, and trash. One of the major tasks of the gin is to separate the fibre form the seed and remove trash. From a growers' perspective the among and percentages of each of the three components are very important as they will determine their economic return. This is commonly referred to as turn out and mostly quoted in percentage, with lint turn out (LTO%), sometimes referred to as gin turn out (GTO%) the most important followed by seed and trash percentages.
